
Transitional Housing A new program at IHN – Main Line

This year IHN – Main Line began piloting a Transitional Housing Program through a partnership with the Salvation Army. This program helps participants obtain and remain in permanent housing for one year, increase their skills and income, and work toward achieving greater self-determination. Cassandra, our IHN – Main Line Case Manager, guides Nakia through her goals as she plans how she will become permanently self-sufficient within her year in our program. Nakia is taking full advantage of her time while in our program. She has already started courses at Gwynedd Mercy College, receiving an "A" in her first course. By next summer she will have completed her associate's degree in business. Although employed, she is actively



looking for a better paying job that will utilize her skills. Through her work with Cassandra and attendance at life skills classes she is learning to budget, save, and permanently improve her life. We are very proud of Nakia and her efforts!

One of the essential features to our program is van. Without it we would not be able to transport our families between the Learning Skills Center in Norristown and the congregations on the Main Line. We use this van twice a day, every day, to transport our families. Our current van is seven years old and has over 132,000 miles on it. It has many bumps and bruises and much wear and tear and is beginning to drain our funds with all its repair bills. We are currently looking to replace it with a new 2011 15 passenger van within the next six months. Of course, to do this we need to raise about \$30,000. Elizabeth Chesick a current Coordinator and Board Member of IHN – Main Line was recently recognized by the Main Line Media News when she was nominated for their 11th annual Volunteer of the Year award. She was honored at a ceremony held at the Montrose Mansion at the Villanova Conference Center on June 23, 2010. Liz was credited with over 10 years of service with IHN – Main Line. Over the years she has served as a Coordinator, Board Member and the Secretary of the Board of Directors. She has stepped up time and again to meet the needs of this organization and the families we serve. Great job Liz!

Community Partnerships

Genesis Housing Corporation: We partner with the Genesis Housing Corporation to provide credit counseling for our families. An experienced Genesis' credit counselor meets with our families to evaluate their credit reports and FICO scores. This allows our families to understand their debt and prioritize the debt they need to pay off in the future, especially the debt they need to pay off before they can move into an apartment.

Literacy Council of Norristown: We view education as the essential factor in helping our families improve their lives and avoid becoming homeless in the future. We have partnered with the Literacy Council of Norristown to provide tutors for the adults in our program who have not received a high school diploma. The Literacy Council of Norristown evaluates each adult student and a volunteer tutors that individual specifically to take the GED exam. The goal is for each student to take the General Education (GED) exam and earn a GED Certificate allowing him or her higher paying employment opportunities. The GED Certificate also makes them eligible for advanced educational opportunities, such as community, technical, or traditional college programs. These all lead to a better paying job and thus, to avoiding homelessness in the future.
