IHN – Main Line is excited to have our first Supportive Housing Program family! This program is made possible through the generous support of the **25th Century Foundation** and **St. David's Episcopal Church**. With their help IHN – Main Line is able to utilize program funds to lease an apartment in Montgomery County for Teren, guaranteeing her and her children stable housing as she pursues a three year degree in cosmetology. Teren received her keys to her new apartment on August 21 (to the delight of her children) and started school on August 26. So far she reports that she is learning a lot and really enjoying school. Hair Styling has been Teren's passion for many years, but without a degree she has been unable to find a stable job in this field. Teren will be going to school part time and also working part time to secure the funds for her other expenses. Additionally, Sonya, our Case Manager, will continue to provide her with case management services, to help her navigate her way through the next three years.

After bouncing around between family and friends Teren came into our Network Self-Sufficiency Program three months ago with her two children. With the support of IHN – Main Line staff and volunteers she has overcome many obstacles and has shown her pure determination to be successful. Although she misses the fellowship she felt in the Network, she is excited and grateful to have this unique opportunity. We are very proud of her and look forward to her next few years with us.

to them that she knows her stuff. Additionally, her daughter visits her on the weekends. They are having great mom and daughter time. She is saving and hopes to move into her own apartment soon.
