IHN – Main Line welcomes a new family into our Housing for Success Program (formerly our Supportive Housing Program). Natasha and her four year old son moved into a new apartment in Eagleville in August 2014. She is enrolled in the criminal justice associate's program at Kaplan University. She hopes to graduate with an associate's degree in December 2015. So far she is doing great in her classes so we expect that she will reach her goal with ease.

This program is made possible through the generous support of the 25th Century

Foundation and St. David's Church. With their help IHN – Main Line is able to utilize program funds to lease an apartment for Natasha, guaranteeing her and her son stable housing as she pursues her degree.

In addition to attending school part-time Natasha will also work part- time to secure the funds for her other expenses. Additionally, Tiffany, our Case Manager, will continue to provide her with case management services, to help her navigate her way through the next three years.

We are so pleased to welcome Tiffany Jones, B.A. as our new case manager. She joined our team in May 2014 and jumped right into her new role. Her firm but pleasant attitude has been a real plus around the office and with our families. We enjoy celebrating the successes of the past year at this event but also look forward to raising funds to support the many life-skills programs and counseling that train our families for sustainable independence.

Your Way Home Update

As you may recall IHN – Main Line has been working with the Montgomery County Your Way Home initiative. Through this partnership we have been accepting referrals from only Montgomery County residents and through the Your Way Home Call Center. The initiative also has established Housing Resource Centers where our families can access a new rapid rehousing program that helps families with first month/last month/security deposit to get into their own apartment then declining levels of help with rent from 3 to 6 months. This year nine of our families/single women received help through this new program.

Unfortunately, there are now waiting lists for the rapid rehousing program and our current families will not be able to access the program. The families are assessed by the call center and given a score and then priority is given to those with the highest scores. Our families tend to score in the midrange level so they tend to continuously be bumped down the list. We will continue to work with the HRCs hoping that things will improve for our families in the future.

The Holidays

The holidays are a busy and stressful time for most families and this is even more so for homeless families. It also provides a special opportunity to help the families in our program. This year we are accepting \$25 gift cards (from Wal-Mart, Target, Toys R Us, etc.) in lieu of presents for the families in our program. Sweet Danielle and her little boy are doing well. She has gone through a lot this past year but has proven to be resilient. She especially benefited from the counseling she received from Debbie. She helped her on her darkest days. Not being a very verbal person it was hard for her to always express her gratitude to the volunteers, who always seemed to be there for her. After some setbacks (none of which were her fault) she was able to prevail and move into an apartment with the help of the YWH Rapid Rehousing Program.

Tionna

Tionna is still with us in our third floor apartment of our Day Center that we utilize as an interim unit for our families that need a little extra time to make it on their own. You may remember her; she sure remembers and is grateful for the volunteers in our Network program. She is especially thankful to the folks who helped when she had to go to the emergency room. Tionna has had a hard time with her pregnancy, but she and her baby are currently fine. She is due November 22. I know she is anxious for that day to come. If you would like to help Tionna prepare for the new arrival we are still accepting gifts at the IHN – Main Line office. Some things she still needs include: a stroller, car seat, diapers, sheets/blankets for a crib, clothing, and bottles.

Jessica

While in our program Jessica used her time wisely. She did not have welfare, a job, or housing when she entered the program. With the help of our case manager she was quickly able to obtain medical insurance, food stamps and cash assistance. With the job coaching she received she was able to find and start a job at Giant. She also learned the value of saving and saved her cash assistance and first few pay checks to help her with moving expenses. She was one of the lucky ones who was able to receive assistance finding and affording an apartment with the new Your Way Home Rapid Rehousing Program. They will continue to help her for 6 months at which time she will be ready to make it on her own.

Nequeah

Nequeah and daughter recently left our Network program. During her stay with us she was able to use the case management offered her and update her resume and references before looking for employment. She was able to find a job in King of Prussia, working there while in our program. She moved out into the house of a relative shortly after starting her employment so that she could work evening hours. She is so grateful to all the volunteers and staff for all they helped her with while in the program.

Looking for an Additional Host Congregation

IHN – Main Line is actively looking for a new host congregation to join our Network. IHN – Main Line is made possible through our partnership with 11 host congregations that work together to provide temporary shelter for three families at one time for three-month intervals. Each host congregation provides overnight lodgings for a week at a time, four or five times a year. Beyond the actual space that they supply, these congregations also provide meals, contribute a multitude of volunteers, and aid the program financially. We would love to have a new host congregation join our Network.

Collaboration in Action

IHN – Main Line works because of our partnerships with area congregations. We truly collaborate to provide shelter and meals for homeless families. Sometimes these collaborations go further than the usual host and support congregation. For example, St. David's Episcopal Church in Radnor is undergoing some major construction and is unable to use its facility to host our families during 2014 and 2015. Luckily for us our other congregations stepped in to help out. Main Line Unitarian Church, another one of our host congregations, is providing space for St. David's during some of St. David's hosting weeks. St. David's volunteers are still providing the staffing, but in the MLUC facility. Also, St. Christopher Episcopal Church in Gladwyne, a very new support congregation, has also made their facility available to St. David's during St. David's hosting weeks. Again St. David's volunteers will travel to St. Christopher's to host our families in that facility. This is collaboration in action, working together within the faith community to provide vital services to those in need. Other congregations have also shared their space in the past. We are sincerely grateful to them for their service.
